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# Equitable Share

## Equitable Share Increases

- **National (or averaged) picture of provincial budgets is largely meaningless**
- **Provincial debts in Eastern Cape, Gauteng and KZN (at least) will affect service delivery this year**
- **Equitable share increase vs. Equitable share *spending* from 2009/2010 below inflation**
- **Ultimately, some provinces being asked to do substantially more with substantially less money**



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# Equitable Share Increases

The preliminary outcome shows that in aggregate six provinces have underspent their adjusted budgets by R2.3 billion. This is largely due to capital expenditure and conditional grants which reflect underspending in most provincial departments for 2009/10. However, Eastern Cape, Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal overspent their adjusted budgets by R3.6 billion in aggregate, largely due to over-expenditure in their education and health departments.

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# Health Budgets

## Provincial Health Budgets

Health expenditure (preliminary outcome) is at R88.6 billion or 102.8 per cent of the R86.2 billion combined health adjusted budgets and is the second largest item (after education) on provincial adjusted budgets (28.4 per cent). The spending pattern reflects an 18.1 per cent or R13.6 billion increase compared with the spending in the 2008/09 financial year.

- **Health budgets overall have grown at less than inflation**
- **Eastern Cape and KZN - after paying health debts - have less money this year than spent last year (-11.7% & -6.3%)**

- **Substantially more money thanks to Conditional Grant (+R1.65 billion)**
- **Some provinces (EC, FS, KZN, MP) used CG top-up in adjustment budget to withdraw ES funding to HIV programmes**
- **Mpumalanga underspent HIV budget by ~R90 million**
